Dear Parent/Guardian:

The Stonington Public Schools offers a choice of milk each school day. Children may buy milk for \$0.30. Children who qualify under U.S. Department of Agriculture guidelines may get milk free. Please call the school for further information.

How do I qualify my child for the Special Milk Program? You can get benefits in one of two ways. You must either complete the free and reduced price school meal/milk application and return it to the school, or bring in a letter from the Department of Social Services.

If your total household income is the same or below the amount on the Free Income Chart (at right), your child may get free milk.

Your child can get free milk if you get food stamps, or Temporary Family Assistance (TFA). The Department of Social Services may provide you with a letter that will automatically qualify your child for free milk. This letter must be brought to school, and can be substituted for completion of this application.

- **Households getting food stamps, or TFA:** You only have to include your child's name, case number and an adult household member must sign the application.
- **Households receiving medical benefits only:** You have to include the names of all household members, the amount of income each person received last month and where the income came from. An adult household member must sign the application and include his or her social security number.
- **Other households:** If you DO NOT have a case number, you have to include the names of all household members, the amount of income each person received last month and where the income came from. An adult household member must sign the application and include his or her social security number.
- **Households with a foster child:** You must include the child's name, the amount of personal use income the child received last month and an adult must sign the application. **Note:** *Subsidized adoptions and subsidized guardianships require the calculation of all household income plus the adoption/guardianship subsidy.*

Can I appeal the school's decision? You can talk to school officials if you do not agree with the school's decision on your application or the results of verification. You also may ask for a fair hearing by calling or writing:

Can homeless, runaway and migrant children get free milk? If you have not been informed that they will get free milk, please call the school or the school homeless liaison, Dr. Mark Hawk at 860-572-0506 ext. 111 to see if your child(ren) qualify.

If I get WIC can my child(ren) get free milk? Children in households participating in WIC may be eligible for free milk. Please fill out an application.

May I apply if someone in my household is not a U.S. citizen? Yes. You or your child(ren) do not have to be a U.S. citizen to qualify for free milk.

We are in the military; do we include our housing allowance as income? If your housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative, do **not** include your housing allowance as income. All other allowances must be included in your gross income.

Will information on my application be kept confidential? We will use the information on your application to decide if your child should get free milk. We may inform officials connected with Title I and the National Assessment of Educational Progress whether your child is eligible for free milk. They will use this information for funding and/or evaluation purposes. Information may also be disclosed if you want the application to be used to get other benefits.

Can I apply for free milk later? You may apply for free milk anytime during the school year. If you are not eligible now but have a change, such as a decrease in household income, an increase in household size, become unemployed or get food stamps or TFA, then you can choose to complete an application.

OPTIONAL WORDING FOR SPONSORS: Can I get other benefits such as health insurance for my child? Your child may be eligible for a health insurance program (called HUSKY) for children. Please refer to the attached addenda for additional benefits.

We will let you know if you are approved or denied.
